





Climate and Diversity Committee

In their recent article "[Historical comparison of gender inequality in scientific careers across countries and disciplines](#)" the authors provide a study of longitudinal gender differences in performance in STEM and argue that although "empirical evidence suggests significant gender differences in the total productivity and impact of academic careers [in STEM]", they find that there is a comparable publication rate and career-wise impact for the same number of publications between the genders. This study suggests instead that differences are due to different publishing career lengths and dropout rates. They hope their study can "help rephrase the conversation around the sustainability of women's careers in academia, with important consequences for institutions and policy makers."
